Project Title: Freeze Mini-Storage and Car Wash

Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

This is a Revised Mitigated Negative Declaration.

The proposed project consists of two components: a mini-storage and a self-serve car wash on vacant property at the intersection of Ski Village Drive and N. Mt. Shasta Boulevard. The mini-storage would consist of 153 storage units in three separate single-story buildings, a 234-square-foot single-story registration office, and a small parking area with five parking stalls. It would include perimeter security fencing. The car wash would have three self-wash bays and one auto-wash, an equipment building, and vacuum station. The project would include landscaping/snow storage areas and sidewalk along Ski Village Drive. A 200-foot-long water line extension would be installed along Road No. 2M16. Car wash wastewater would be collected in a separate treatment system prior to discharge to the City's wastewater system in accordance with an industrial waste discharge permit issued by the City. The project would include an on-site stormwater collection and treatment system for runoff prior to discharge to City storm drain. The project would operate seven days a week from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Aesthetics (change in visual quality of site from vacant to developed and new source light/glare): MM AES-1 through AES-4 (additional fencing for screening, revise landscaping plan, lighting plan). Biological Resources (construction impacts): MM BIO-1 through MM BIO-7 (nesting birds and bat roost surveys). Cultural/Tribal Cultural Resources (no known resources but potential for inadvertent discovery): MM CUL-1 and CUL-2 and TCR-1 (stop work, evaluate, and manage if resources or remains found). Geology and Soils (erosion, presence of fill and potential for soil instability): MM GEO-1 and GEO-2 (prepare and implement SWPPP and final grading plan). Hazardous Materials (car wash wastewater; potential for encountering contaminated soils from past activities at site): MM HAZ-1 (obtain and comply with final waste discharge permit from City); MM HAZ-2 (stop work, evaluate, and manage soil contamination if found). Hydrology and Water Quality (stormwater discharges): MM HYD-1 (finalize on-site drainage plan, confirm off-site culvert capacity, monitor flow quantity and quality, long-term maintenance of on-site system). Noise (construction activities, auto wash dryer, vacuum station): MM NOI-1 (comply with City construction noise standards); MM NOI-2 (reduce auto wash dryer noise or provide noise barrier to meet City noise standard); MM NOI-3 (reduce vacuum station noise to meet City noise standard); MM NOI-4 (prohibit dynamic mode vibratory roller use or use other methods to reduce construction vibration). Transportation (construction traffic and roadway surfaces): MM TRA-1 (construction traffic control plan); MM TRA-2 (pave roadway segment adjacent to mini-storage).
