Yes-

It means that if the charter school is listed (whether or not the numbers are reported) it's one of the schools that are obligated to serve resident children in the attendance boundary.

Basically, it means that the charter school must enroll children living within the attendance boundary before enrolling children living outside the attendance boundary. In this way it operates the same as a LAUSD resident area school.

Conversion charters and PSC charters will be listed, but start-up charters will not be listed.

Hi Gwenn,

It's not inconsistent to report on some types of charter schools and not others. For EIR reporting the main thing to consider is if the charter school has/d a resident attendance area when it became a charter school (LAUSD school conversion or new school opening). If so, then the general rule is to include the school in the report and supply resident area projections .

In the past, some charter schools did not report individual student enrollments directly to the District. Therefore, there's been a need to include footnote "*" in the Enrollment and Capacity report.
