#### PRESENT LAND USE/ZONING/GENERAL PLAN USE DESIGNATION:

The project is currently undeveloped, is located in Planning Area 9 of the Reche Canyon Specific Plan (RCSP), and is designated "Estate Density".

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION (please use a separate page if necessary)

The project proposes the development of approximately 18,770 square feet of commercial uses including: 3,574 square foot (sf) fueling station with 6 fueling dispensers, a 3,000 sf convenience store, 9,800 sf of neighborhood commercial retail space, and a 1,750 sf drive through car wash. The project includes a Specific Plan Amendment to change the existing Reche Canyon Specific Plan (RCSP) Land Use from "Estate Density Land Use" to "Commercial Land Use" and to add "automobile fueling" as a conditional use.
