RESERVOIRS AND SITE IMPROVEMEN PROJECT (PROJECT), WATER
SYSTEM ID NUMBER 3610041

The City of Rialto (City) is the lead agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the proposed Project. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), as a responsible agency pursuant to CEQA, has reviewed the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) prepared by the City dated August 30, 2012. During the public review period no written comments were received. The MND was adopted and the Project was approved by the Planning Commission on July 2012. The City of Rialto filed a Notice of Determination (NOD) with the San Bernardino County Clerk's Office on August 30, 2012.

Project Description:

The Company proposes to construct two aboveground water storage reservoirs, a future booster station, and associated piping and related improvements. The reservoirs at Plant F58 will be used to store water and gravity feed to consumers in the City of Rialto. The future booster station will be used to transport water to San Gabriel's Plant F19, which is located a few miles to the west.

Determination:

As a responsible agency, the State Water Board has considered the MND dated July 19, 2012 together with all comments and Division of Financial Assistance, Special Project Review Unit staff hereby recommend the following findings for the Project:

- The Project will not result in any significant water quality impacts.
