Project Decription (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed Project is located in the cities of San Marcos, Vista, Carlsbad, Escondido, and unincorporated areas in northern San Diego County, California. It would originate at the San Marcos Substation on the west and terminate at the Escondido Substation on the east and would be located within SDG&E right-of-way (ROW). To fully accommodate the proposed Project, 1.2 acres of additional ROW would be acquired in San Marcos. The proposed Project would include a combination of approximately 12 miles of new overhead single-circuit electric power line structures, rebuild of existing structures from single circuit to double circuit, and the reconductoring and re-energizing of existing conductors.

The proposed Project's potentially significant effects include those associated with biological resources, cultural resources, geology, soils, seismicity and paleontolgical resources, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology, and water quality, noise, public services, recreation, transportation, tribal cultural resources, utilities, and wildfire. All of these impacts would be reduced to less than significant levels by implementation of Applicant Proposed Measures and additional mitigation measures as presented in the IS/MND.

One possible area of controversy known to the Lead Agency is the rise of wildfire and its effects on surrounding communities with limited access roads during an emergency.
