

This project fits under portions of three classes of Categorical Exemptions to CEQA: Class 4 (Minor Alterations to Land) and Class 6 (Information Collection). The project activities will all occur within previously disturbed areas. The areas where new ground disturbing activities might occur are limited and are minor in scope.

Field review by CAL FIRE staff confirmed that no exceptions apply that would preclude the use of a notice of exemption for this project.
