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INTRODUCTION

The Providence Development Corporation of Walnut Creek, California has requested that Native-X, Inc. Archaeological Services conduct a cultural resources study of an undeveloped, one-acre parcel located in Pleasant Hill, Contra Costa County, California. The project area is located within a residential area, along McKissick Street. The proposed project entails the development of the parcel into a small subdivision and the construction of four single-family homes. It also includes the installation of a storm drain along existing McKissick Street and Hubbard Avenue. Storm drain installation will occur by excavating a trench in the already existing gravel and asphalt roads. The one-acre parcel and the storm drain installation are considered the Area of Potential Effect (APE). No structures exist on this parcel; however, the project entails ground disturbing activities that have the potential to impact cultural resources. The project is located within the city of Pleasant Hill on the unsectioned USGS 7.5' Walnut Creek 1995 quadrangle (T.1N., R.2W). The center of the parcel is located at 571213 mE x 4199698 mN (NAD83). Project location with new survey is shown on Figures 1 and 2 (attached).

Native-X, Inc. initiated a records search in early November, 2018. After receiving the results from the Northwest Information Center that no previous surveys have occurred within the APE and that no sites had been previously recorded, archaeologist Shane Davis (M.A., R.P.A.) conducted a pedestrian survey on December 2, 2018. No cultural resources were discovered within the APE during the course of the survey and no built environment features were observed within the proposed project area.

RESEARCH AND CONSULTATION

Previous Studies and Archival Research

In November, 2018, a records search was conducted by the Northwest Information Center, California Historical Resources Information System (File No.: 18-0907) for the proposed project area and within a 0.5 mile radius. No previously known resources were found to exist within the project area or within 0.5 mile. Additionally, no previous surveys were known to have occurred within the project area; however, seven were noted within the 0.5 mile radius. The complete results of the file search are presented in Appendix A.

Native American Consultation

On November 6, 2018, Native-X, Inc. contacted the California Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) in Sacramento in order to request any information regarding archaeological sites or traditional cultural properties that may be within or adjacent to the project area that would be of importance to Native American groups. The NAHC replied on November 19, 2018 and stated that a search of the Sacred Lands File was completed for the APE with negative results. They also supplied a list of six individuals to contact for further consultation. The proponent requested that Native-X, Inc. supply them with the list whereby they would give it to the City of Pleasant Hill. The City will decide if further consultation is warranted. Native-X, Inc. gave the list to the proponent on November 20, 2018. Appendix B includes the NAHC request for information, their response, and the consultation list.

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BACKGROUND

Environment

The project area lies at approximately 75 feet in elevation in Ygnacio Valley near the center of the city of Pleasant Hill. The historic use of the area as orchards is no longer obvious. City development has occurred in great density all around the APE. Although the project area itself has not been so developed, the ground has been disturbed. The parcel lies behind all of the adjoining residences. Vegetation currently consists primarily of oak, ash, blackberry, bunchgrass, and a few non-native domestics. Slope is gentle at less than 2% with an aspect toward the northeast. Soil is a dark brown clay with occasional traces of asphalt and concrete that were likely brought in during adjacent development or use of the parcel as a staging area or storage location. The portion of the APE which includes the storm drain, proceeds down a gravel road and an asphalt street (McKissick and Hubbard respectively).

Cultural Context

A general summary of cultural history for the project area may be found in Bennyhoff and Fredrickson (1994), Cook (1957), Kroeber, Loud, and Heizer (1970), Levy (1978), Milliken et al. (2007), Moratto (1984), and others. However, no archaeological resources were previously recorded within or within 0.5 mile of the APE and no cultural resources were newly discovered during this survey. The APE and adjacent area have been heavily impacted by urban development. An in depth cultural context is not necessary for this project. However, if an in depth discussion of ethnography, prehistory, and history, specific to this area is needed in the future, refer to Shoup (2016:7-12). Shoup reported (NWIC Report S-48225) on a project 0.4 miles to the west and gives a detailed cultural summary of the vicinity.

FIELD METHODS AND FINDINGS

Survey Methods

Shane Davis (M.A.), registered professional archaeologist, surveyed the entire project area on December 2, 2018. This included both the one-acre block and the proposed storm drain route (110 meters east down McKissick Street and 100 meters south on Hubbard Avenue). Survey of the block parcel utilized pedestrian transects spaced at five meters or less. Survey along the roads was hindered by gravel and asphalt. Ground visibility within the parcel was fair to good ranging from 50% to 75%. All areas within the parcel exhibiting mineral soil were given additional scrutiny.

Survey Results

No prehistoric or historic archaeological resources were located during the course of the survey. No built environment resources exist within the APE.

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Native-X, Inc. Archaeological Services conducted a cultural resources study of an undeveloped, one-acre parcel located in Pleasant Hill, Contra Costa County, California. The project area is located within a residential area, along McKissick Street. The proposed project entails the development of the parcel into a small subdivision and the construction of four single-family homes. It also includes the installation of a storm drain along existing McKissick Street and Hubbard Avenue.

The APE was surveyed on December 2, 2018. No prehistoric or historic archaeological resources were located during the course of the survey. No built environment resources exist within the APE.

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The proposed project will have no effect on any known significant archaeological or built environment resources.

If during project implementation unrecorded archaeological material is observed, it is recommended that project activities cease in the area of the find and that a qualified archaeologist be contacted to assess its significance.

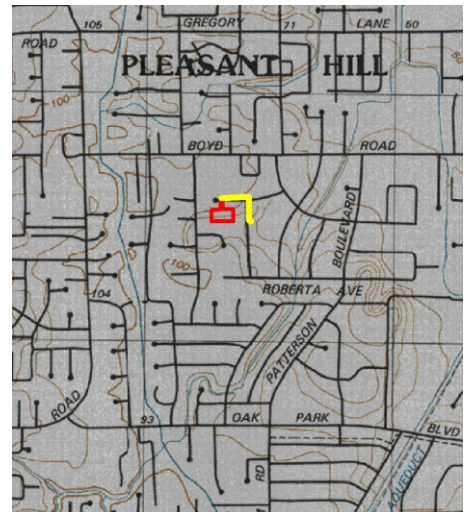
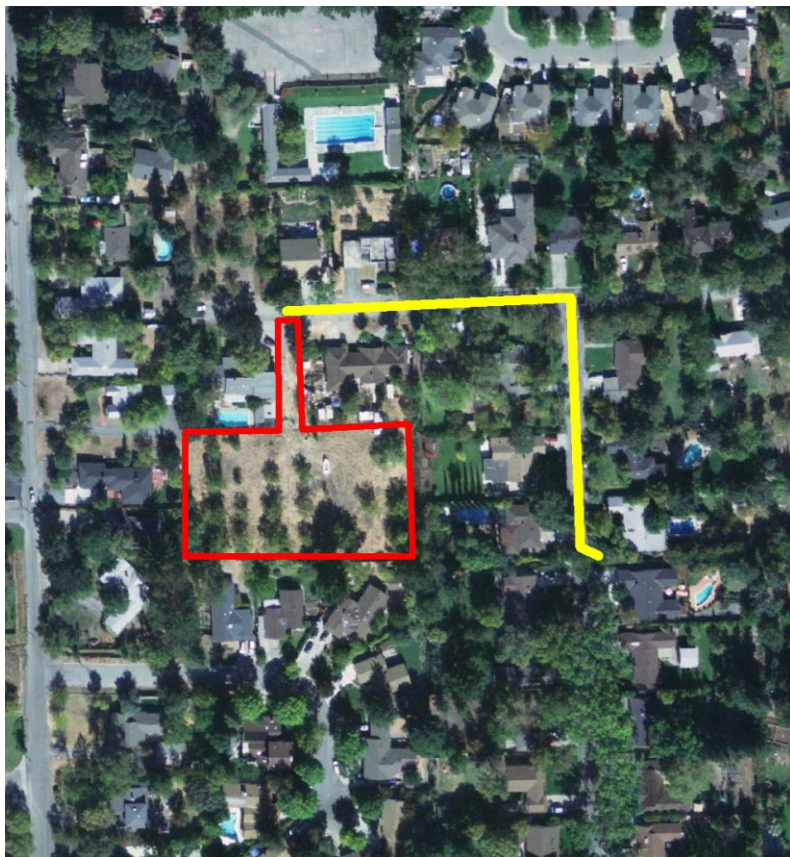

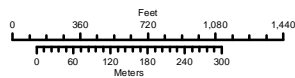

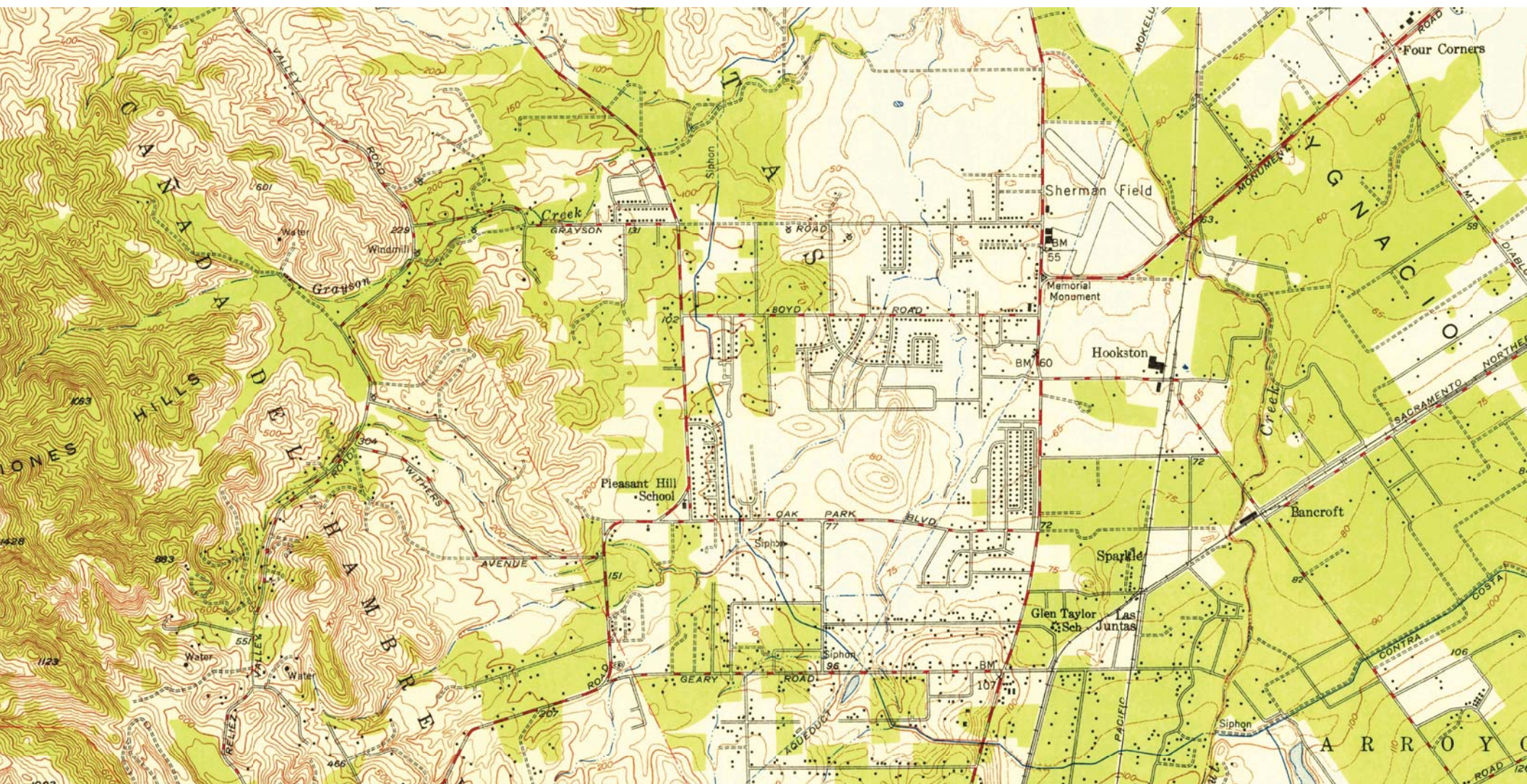
1897 USGS Concord 15' Quadrangle



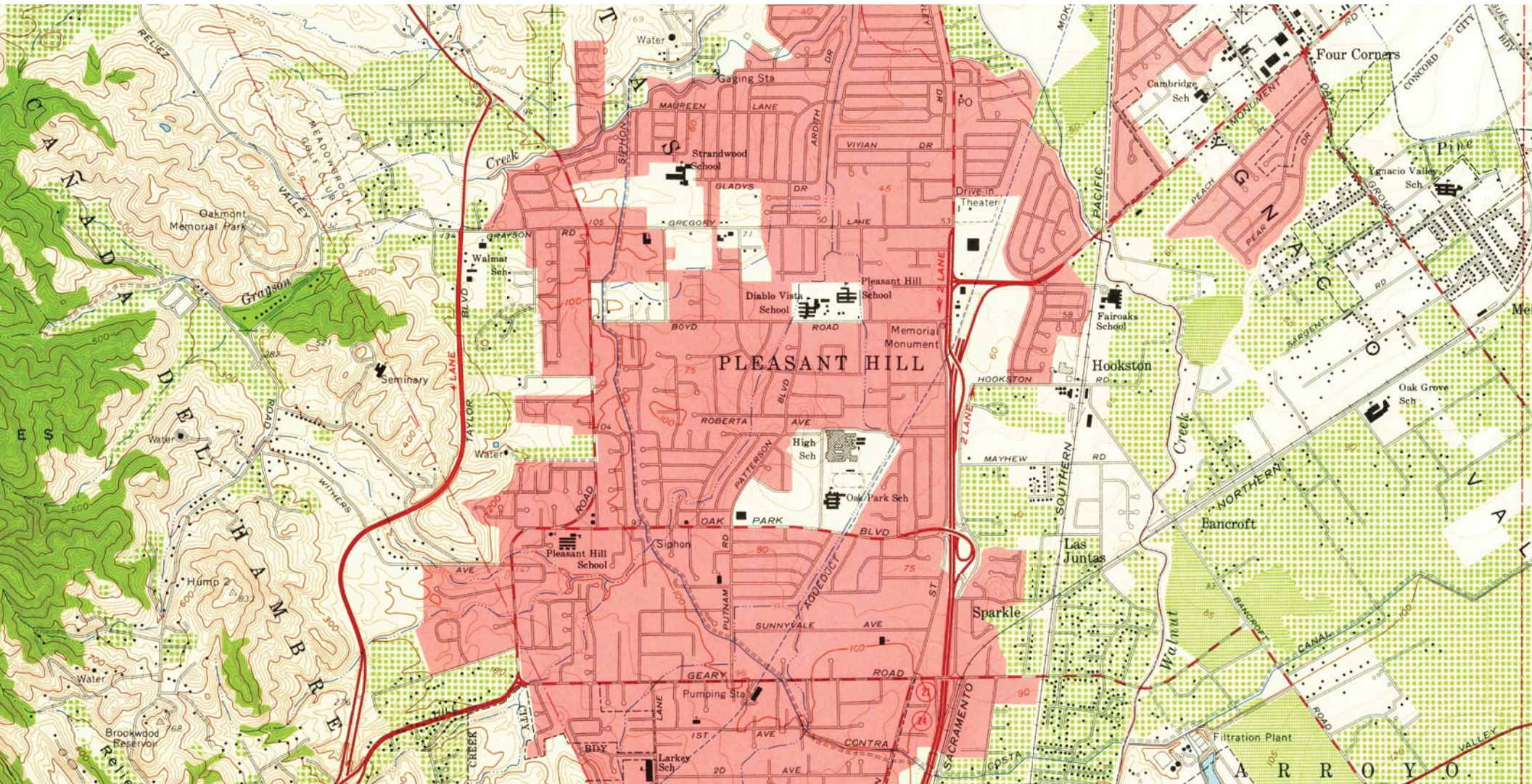
1915 USGS Concord 15' Quadrangle
