Additionally, the BLIP would increase the maximum permitted daily tonnage by 500 tons per day (tpd) from 4,500 tpd to 5,000 tpd, add an organics processing operation, and allow for other minor administrative and operational changes. The BLIP will not change the hours of operation or increase the permitted number of vehicles/trucks allowed at the landfill.
