DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: This project will establish wildfire defensible space around the historic Boucher Fire Lookout and will be focused on the western aspect of the hilltop below the fire lookout tower and directly around the tower itself. The distance trimmed will be either from the edge of any structure to the pavement and/or approximately 50' total. On the west side of the roadway, 100' of the coffee berry brush both directions will be removed and chipped for soil stabilization. The only soil disturbance will be foot traffic only. The goal is to have 100 feet of minimized fuel load around the lookout tower in order to reduce a wildfire's ability to spread and to better defend the tower. The roadside of the Boucher Loop will be clearing from the pavement out 20'. Tools used will be hand lopper, chipper, and weed whacker.
