Project Location (include county): The project to be completed is located within the Mattole River watershed, approximately 3.9 miles north northeast of the town of Ettersburg, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 21, T3S, R2E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Ettersburg U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 221-111-015; latitude 40.185 N and longitude 123.970 W.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2018-0386-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mr. Semen Beznosov.

The project is limited to five encroachments. All five encroachments are proposed to meet Humboldt Counties requirements commercial cannabis Retirement, Remediation, and Relocation Program (RRR). The proposed encroachments include removal of infrastructure at a point of diversion (POD), realignment of a diverted stream to its original channel, and decommissioning of three road/stream crossings. Work for these projects will include excavation, removal of fill, reconstruction of a stream channel, revegetation, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
