Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Municipal Wayfinding Project, in total, will implement a comprehensive, user-friendly, and attractive signage and wayfinding system in Mammoth Lakes. The project will implement a number of goals and action items established in the Town's 2007 General Plan, as well as accepted Neighborhood District Plans, the Destination Resort Community and Economic Development Strategy, and the Draft Mobility Element. The Project will provide directional guidance to various public and private destinations, including parks, recreation opportunities, public parking facilities, etc. and includes a hierarchy of signage components (district monuments, vehicle signage, pedestrian signage, and parking and facility signage) to effectively guide visitors to their destinations.

Reasons why project is exempt: The placement of new signage along areas of existing facilities will not cause a significant impact on the environment. The proposed signage types include single and double pole mounts placed along existing road and pedestrian corridors. The typical areas of ground disturbance will be limited to less than a few feet for each new post dug.
