General:

 Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact the Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources discovered.

Cultural:

- o If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 - 1. Stop all work within a 60foot radius of discovery
 - 2. Protect the discovery area
 - 3. Notify the Engineer
 - The Department Investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a
 qualified archaeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area
 until authorized.
- o If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Hazardous Waste:

- Caltrans Standard Special Provision 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) pertaining to earth material containing lead, shall be included in the contract.
- o Caltrans Standard Special Provision 14-11.12 pertaining to the removal of yellow traffic stripe and pavement markings shall be included in the contract.

Biology:

- o If construction will occur during bird nesting season (February 1st through September 30th), contact the Environmental Office at least one month prior to the start of construction to schedule a pre-construction bird survey with a Caltrans Biologist. The pre-construction survey will need to be completed within 14 days prior to the start of construction.
- Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-6.03A regarding protective radii shall be included in the construction contract. If active migratory bird nests are observed, a 100-foot buffer shall be established. For hawks, a 300-foot buffer shall be established.

No permits required.
