A proposal to install a pedestrian crossing for the Gray Whale Cove State Beach in order to improve pedestrian safety for beach users. Project elements include the addition of a pedestrian crosswalk on Highway 1; pedestrian hybrid beacons; widening pavement for the addition of a left turn lane and an acceleration lane; relocation and improvement of the parking lot entrance; as well as installation of associated overhead lighting, overhead signs and roadside signs. Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Two significant impacts have been identified, the first is related to visual impacts due to tree removal. Three large cypress trees must be removed in order to accommodate the road improvements and improve sight distance for southbound drivers to avoid hitting pedestrians walking within the crosswalk. In conformance with the County's significant tree protection ordinance, three replacement trees will be planted in the surrounding area.

The second potential impact is related to the potential for California red-legged frog and San Francisco garter snake to move through the construction area while the project is under construction. Standard measures, including the erection of snake and frog-proof fencing around the construction zone have been included as mitigation measures.
