Project Location: The project is located within the boundaries of Sacramento County and covering 6.1 miles of the Natomas East Main Drainage Canal (NEMDC/Steelhead Creek), 2.2 miles of Dry Creek, 2.7 miles of Robla Creek, 1.3 miles of Magpie Creek, 2.2 miles of Arcade Creek, 0.7 miles of Don Julio Creek, Wolf Ranch, and the 18A Site.
