The second encroachment includes the decommissioning of an existing 18" CCP culvert that transitions into a 24" CMP culvert on a Class III watercourse. The third encroachment includes reconstructing an existing rock ford on a Class II watercourse with larger diameter washed rock. Work for these encroachments will include excavation, removal of the failing culverts, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
